# ACADEMIC INFORMATION

The school's four-year curriculum (Degree of Translation and Interpreting) and five-year curriculum (Double Degree of Translation and Tourism) comply with the European higher education framework. The teaching modules follow the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS), facilitating exchanges with other universities abroad. International students nominated to spend their mobility at the FTI can also take 2 courses per semester in other faculties at the UGR. **Grading Scales:** 5 grade levels, based on a scale from 0 (lowest) to 10 (highest), awarded per exam. An overall grade will be awarded at the end of the degree course.

## Language requirements:

The regular language of instruction is Spanish. In order to be accepted as Erasmus student it is recommended to demonstrate a minimum level (B1) of proficiency in the language of instruction. The Vice-Rector's Office will provide information on the accreditation exams offered by the University of Granada remotely in order to facilitate the fulfilment of this requirement for those people with difficulties of access to examination centres, especially in the framework of development cooperation programmes.

## COST OF LIVING IN GRANADA

The city of Granada is considered to be one of the cheapest places in Spain and Europe to live, as a student. Obviously, the cost of living for each student depends on their lifestyle, but it tends to vary between €700-€800 per month.

For guidance purposes, we have calculated the average cost of living in Granada in the most basic aspects:

Accommodation in a shared flat (water and energy expenses excluded) varies roughly between €250-€350 per month.

The daily set menu at the university canteens costs €3.50. The takeaway menu costs €6.

A single city-bus ticket costs €1.60. If you obtain a bus card, the price is €0.40 per trip and with the University bus pass the cost is €0.65 per trip. (Please note that at this moment there is a reduction of 50% in all city-bus fares).

# HOUSING

- Finding accommodation in the city of Granada is not a very big issue. Usually, there are many types of accommodation for international students-don't forget that Granada is the number #1 receiving Erasmus in Europe! So, renting a flat is not difficult at all, but you won't always find what you were looking for. It depends on your budget, preferred location and facilities, but generally there won't be any problems. Granada has plenty of shared flats for students, local and international; the city's lifestyle goes around the University.
- The University does not make any specific accommodation arrangements, it merely facilitates the student's search and does not mediate between the student and the owner of the accommodation, but only offers information. The particular conditions of your accommodation must be negotiated and agreed personally with the owner of the accommodation. None of these accommodations are closed, it depends on availability on the date you arrive. Contact and ask for information in the accommodation you are interested in.
